Bronze Expedition Overview



The entry level of the DofE Award, our Bronze level programmes provide a perfect introduction to expeditions with supportive and friendly instructors.



To help the Bronze Award be accessible to more young people, the DofE have adjusted the requirements for the expedition.

We are therefore able to offer 2 packages, to suit different budgets and the level of training required by your students.

OPTION 1

5 days - including overnight Practice expedition.

Suitable for:

Participants who have no experience of camping and have aspirations of moving on to complete their Silver or Gold Award.

OPTION 2

4 days - Including a training walk only.

Suitable for:

Participants with limited budgets who have, ideally, already taken part in camping activities and navigation training.

Programme Co-ordinator

With vast knowledge in delivering DofE programmes, they will work with the school through the expedition delivery process to create an incredible and smooth experience for all participants.

Instructors

Our team of Instructors are qualified, knowledgeable and passionate about the DofE Award and the benefits of young people being involved. They have been carefully selected to work on these expeditions. We operate a staffing ratio of 1:2 teams.

Office Support

Throughout the planning and delivery process our office support staff will be on hand if you have any queries or questions. They also carry out a duty manager role 24-hours a day, in case there are any emergencies during your expedition.

Safety and Supervision



Remote Supervision

Remote supervision is when the safety and well-being of a group is monitored from a distance, with limited direct contact with the group. This technique gives groups an independence whilst being kept safe.

In order to complete a DofE expedition, teams need to have met the '20 Expedition Conditions' laid down by The Award. The first of these is that the expedition is unaccompanied and self-sufficient without outside assistance. For this objective to be met, groups cannot be "led" by an instructor. We are still responsible for the safety of the group, so they will be monitored throughout, and we do this by remote supervision.

GSM Trackers

All teams carry a GSM tracking device. This signal from the tracker is plotted on an online password protected map, which is only accessible by the expedition staff via their phones or computer.

The trackers are used as an additional layer of security and not as a replacement for experienced staff supervising participants.

Ratios



Staffing Ratios

The Adventure Element Ltd staffing is based on a ratio of 1:1 teams for Training & Practice and 1:2 teams for Qualifying expeditions. In addition, a dedicated Programme Coordinator is also allocated for larger expeditions of over 4 teams who will oversee the smooth delivery of the programme. Our staff are highly experienced and qualified Instructors and each are registered DofE Assessors.

Their role is to provide technical training and safety supervision. They will be on-hand throughout the expedition to ensure the safety of all students and staff.

All staff carry mobile phones and, where appropriate, a 2-way radio. This helps to ensure a smooth running expedition and clear communications in the event of an emergency.

Staffing Ratios (school staff)

Pastoral care for the participants is provided by school / group staff, who will also be available throughout the expedition. We require a minimum of 1 member of school / group staff. They will be supported by The Adventure Element instructors (including overnight) who will assist should any incident occur.

Expedition Support

Not every School or Group will fit in to our range of expedition packages and may require something a bit more bespoke.

If this is you, then we are experts in designing expeditions which suit the needs of the students, the school or group or you as the organiser.
